

Eva Grove Biography

Eva Grove was born in 1935 in pre-Nazi Austria. When she was three years old her family left Austria to escape Nazism and anti-Semitism. The family first moved to Bolivia, and 15 years later to New York City. She earned a BA from Hunter College (NYC) and a MSW from Columbia University. She worked as a social worker in adoptions before becoming a full-time mother.

She was in the cheering section of Intel's founding and growing up. And she still marvels at the trajectory that Intel took. She lived through the uncertainty of Intel's early years, the worries that the 1101 and/or the 3101 would be viable, Intel's going public, was heartened by seeing so many intelites reap profit with Intel in its success. She saw hard times like "the 125% (110%?) Solution", the Floating-Point crisis. There were lots of good times as well: wonderful family picnics, celebrations of new devices and new landmarks, a celebration of the survival of the "125%". The Five-Year Anniversary boat adventure in San Francisco Bay. A blow-out 25th Anniversary complete with Broadway caliber play.

In 1986 Andy and Eva founded the Grove Foundation, which is dedicated to issues close to their hearts. As Intel prospered the Foundation grew as well and immersed itself in significant issues.

Eva was also a long-term volunteer at Planned Parenthood Mar Monte's San Jose Clinic. As a volunteer she did pregnancy tests and pregnancy related counseling. She retired from that in about 2010.

She is currently a board member of the ILRC (Immigrant Legal Resource Center) in SF and has been volunteering as a tutor to aspiring citizens.
